Northern Heath Resource COVID-19 Community Toolkit

To empower local partners to share helpful information, we have created the <u>COVID-19</u> Community Toolkit, a digital resource for community partners with **3 key goals**:

- Get more people registered for their vaccine.
- Highlight the community benefits of getting vaccinated.
- Provide direction to *trusted* sources of information about vaccines and COVID-19.

The toolkit includes:

- Links to factual sources of information.
- Digital images suitable for sharing on your website, social media platforms, email, or newsletter.
- Printable posters and infographics.

As trusted sources of information, community-based partners such as yourselves have a vital role to play in supporting public messaging, as people look for guidance and direction.

Our hope is that you, or your designated communications staff, will download and share these resources through your own internal communications channels, such as in a group email, on your website, through social media, in a digital newsletter, or printed and posted in your facility, supporting more Northern BC residents to get vaccinated.

COVID-19 Outbreak update

COVID-19 – Outbreak declared over – Heritage Manor II, Fort St. John

Northern Health is pleased to advise that a COVID-19 outbreak declared May 18, 2021 at the Heritage Manor II assisted living facility in Fort St. John, BC, is officially over.

There were a total of five lab-confirmed cases of COVID-19 associated with the outbreak, involving residents of the facility. All of the residents have since recovered.

Northern Health would like to thank Heritage Manor II staff, residents and their families, for their patience, cooperation and support in recent weeks.

COVID-19 outbreak declared over – Quesnel reforestation operations (closure orders rescinded)

Northern Health Medical Health Officers have declared an end to a COVID-19 outbreak involving the operations of two Quesnel-based reforestation companies, originally declared May 20, 2021.

BC Vaccination Coverage Rates and COVID-19 activity – New Dashboard

As of June 22, **7,800** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Cases currently active: **60**
- New cases: 7
- Currently in hospital: 5
- Currently in ICU level care in hospital: 5
- Deaths in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic: 155
