Northern Health celebrates 70% COVID-19 immunization

Northern Health has hit the 70% COVID-19 immunization mark due to collaborative efforts across the region.

Now it's time to reach for 75%. Some communities, like <u>Kitimat</u>, have exceeded 80% vaccination rates. We look forward to seeing more communities reach new vaccination records – especially as summer holidays continue a new school year edges closer.

As of August 17, **8,163** cases have been reported in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Cases currently active: 206
- New cases: 35
- Currently in hospital: 2
 - o Currently in ICU level care in hospital: 4
- Deaths in the NH region since the beginning of the pandemic: 159

International Overdose Awareness Day is August 31, 2021

International Overdose Awareness Day (IOAD) is the world's largest annual campaign to end overdose. It is a time to pause and acknowledge those lives lost and those family and friends who are deeply impacted by both overdose events and overdose deaths in our communities.

Holding a local event is one way to show support and raise awareness in an effort to bring an end to further loss and the stigma associated with substance use.

Ideas for local community events are:

- Support from municipalities to declare the day International Overdose Awareness Day
- Hold a memorial service
- Plant a tree, offer candle lighting or banner signing
- Offer space for tributes
- Have a BBQ with speakers or an open mic
- Write a press release regarding IOAD and your community event plans
- Run an educational campaign
- Train community members on overdose recognition and response and distribute naloxone
